On Tuesday May 3, 2022 at 6:09 pm at The Catamount Lodge on Hillsdale Road, Egremont, Moderator Stephen Cohen called the meeting to order. Moderator Cohen attested to the proper service of the warrant, noted the presence of a quorum, gave instructions for the meeting and introduced Town Officials. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and a moment of silence to honor the victims of COVID-19, the suffering in Ukraine and to thank members of the military, police and fire departments for their service was observed.

**ARTICLE 1:** Selectboard Chairman George McGurn gave his appreciation to those in attendance and thanked the staff at Catamount Lodge. Chairman McGurn then spoke to the months of work that went into the warrant especially under the challenges of COVID. He mentioned the work ahead on the updated Master Plan and invited residents to participate. He also spoke to the soon-to-be redesigned town website which will be up and available soon.

**Article 4:** Motion made and seconded to authorize the Selectboard to form a study group to consider infrastructure, governance, and ownership options of the Egremont Water Department.

**Vote taken:** motion passed by majority show of hands.

**Article 5:** Motion made and seconded to appropriate \$2,000,000.00 to pay costs of making necessary water line upgrades and repairs to a portion of Main Street, including the payment of all other costs incidental or related thereto, and to that to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Select Board, is authorized to borrow said amount under and pursuant to G.L. c. 44, Section 8 (5) or any other enabling authority, and to issue bonds or notes of the Town therefor. While any amount authorized to be borrowed by this vote shall constitute a general obligation of the Town in accordance with the General Laws, any such borrowing is expected to be paid, in the first instance, from the Water Department enterprise fund.

Short discussion ensued as to what portion of Main Street will be covered and will the timeline work in coordination with the upcoming Main Street renovation.

Residents were instructed to use the dedicated ballot they received when they checked in and cast their vote by secret ballot.

**Secret ballot taken:** Moderator announced the motion passed by required 2/3 vote of 67 YES to 12 NO

**Article 6:** Motion made and seconded to fix the maximum amount that may be spent during fiscal year 2023 from the revolving funds established in Egremont General Bylaw 24, to be amounts specified in the warrant, such revolving funds to be for the departments, boards, committees, agencies and officers specified in the warrant all in accordance with Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 44, Section 53E  $\frac{1}{2}$ .

**Article 7:** Motion made and seconded to adopt the following *General Bylaw*: The owner of property abutting a public sidewalk within Egremont shall be responsible for taking all reasonable steps to maintain the abutting sidewalk clear of snow and ice. An owner who fails to comply within 24 hours after the end of a snowfall will be fined \$10 for the first offense. Each subsequent 24-hour failure to comply will be considered a separate \$10 fine.

Discussion ensued. Some voiced it was unfair, some questioned who would oversee clearing areas of sidewalk that was not in front of a home, some felt it would negatively impact those over age 55.

Motion was made and seconded to table the motion for a future date.

**Vote taken: motion to table passed by majority show of hands.**

**Article 8:** Motion made and seconded to transfer from free cash the sum of \$275,000 to construct a new building to house the Buildings and Grounds Department.

Questions were asked regarding using "annex building" for this purpose (estimated to cost \$1,000,000 to renovate) and will current building be sold (that will be addressed at a future Town Meeting)

**Article 9:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,212.00 for completion, maintenance and upkeep of the Pollinator Garden at French Park

Elizabeth Keene of Indian Line Farm spoke to the article. She stated this will not be an annual ask.

**Vote taken: motion passed by unanimous show of hands.**

**Article 10:** Motion made to raise and appropriate transfer the sum of \$3,450.00 for the repairs at the Town's Cemeteries.

Mary Brazie made motion to amend to transfer \$3,450.00 from Cemetery Perpetual Care for repairs at the Town's Cemeteries. Motion was seconded.

**Vote taken: motion passed by unanimous show of hands.**

**Article 11:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to make repairs at French Park.

Question was asked as to how the funds will be spent. Tom Reynolds answered \$1,500 for new fencing and \$2,500 for mulch.

**Vote taken: motion passed by unanimous show of hands.**

**Article 12:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,000.00 to purchase a plow for the Highway Department.

**Vote taken: motion passed by unanimous show of hands.**

**Article 13:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 to update a portion of the town's MACRS historic listings.

Susan Bachelder, former chairperson of the Historical Commission spoke to this expenditure.

**Vote taken: motion passed by majority show of hands.**

**Article 14:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000.00 as the Town's 25% share of the amount of the \$20,000 specified in a grant from the Community Forest Stewardship Grant for purpose of removal of invasive plants in French Park.

Motion made and seconded to amend the motion by adding at the end thereof ", such appropriation to be conditioned on receipt of said grant."

**Article 15:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to pay for tree removal on town property (other than town roads).

**Article 16:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 to replace the fire/police alarm system at the Library.

**Vote taken: motion passed by unanimous show of hands.**

**Article 17:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$55,000.00 to purchase and install a new Trash Compactor.

**Vote taken: motion passed by unanimous show of hands.**

**Article 18:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 to replace the front door at Town Hall.

**Vote taken: motion passed by majority show of hands.**

**Article 19:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150,000.00 and to transfer from free cash the sum of \$50,000.00 to make road repairs to Town roads.

**Vote taken: motion passed by a unanimous show of hands.**

**Article 20:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$85,000.00 to blacktop a portion of the Town Hall driveway and parking lot.

**Vote taken: Motion passed by a hand count of 37 in favor, 26 opposed.**

**Article 21:** Motion made and seconded to accept funds being provided by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts under the provisions of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, to pay for such costs as allowed by appropriate legislation in connection with the maintenance, repair, and construction of Town ways and bridges.

**Article 22:** Motion made and seconded to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 to the special GASB 45 stabilization fund (for future retiree benefits other than pension).

**Motion made and seconded to dissolve the Town Meeting. Motion passed. The Moderator dissolved the meeting at 8:05 pm.**
